

The University's School of Commerce Dean and Mrs. Preston Brooks ordered "The Cottage," a Sears bungalow, for \$2,100 in 1922. It was erected in the new Five Points suburbs at 123 West View Drive. The exterior of the four-bedroom structure is West Coast redwood. Mrs. Brooks was renowned for the house's gardens. From 1960 until 2012, the residence was owned by the Frank Harris Lowery family.

This house at 257 Woodlawn Avenue was built as the residence of Dr. and Mrs. Clarence Neel Walker. Lois Witcher, later Mrs. Walker, was one of the first women to graduate from the University of Georgia. This lady ordered a ready-cut house, No. 2554, from the Gordon-Van Tine Company of Iowa. In July 1917, the materials used to build the two-story dwelling were shipped from Davenport to Athens, and Mrs. Walker sub-contracted the construction herself. It has been the home of Suzanne and Allen King for the last 50 years.
